

# City of Orange Beach—Information BP / Deepwater Horizon Incident Oil Spill



April 29, 2010 11am

The City of Orange Beach is proactively working with Unified Command and all agencies involved in the oil incident aftermath. The US Coast Guard is the lead federal agency coordinating and assisting BP with response and recovery efforts. The City of Orange Beach stands ready to assist the efforts of the Recovery Teams in order to protect our coastline and coastal resources. Please refer to the information below for the most up to date information and data available regarding this incident in the Gulf of Mexico.

As of this release, BP is proactively placing booms at the mouth of bays, inlets and sensitive areas all along the gulf coast. This is a precautionary measure in the event that our area is affected by the spill. We do not expect impacts within the 72 hour period which ends Sunday, May 2. At the present time, there is no evidence of any oil, slick or sheen from this incident, in our immediate area.

Waters and shorelines around the City of Orange Beach are open and exhibiting normal conditions.
